## Rural Life Vintage Revival 2022 Stallholder Information Pack

Saturday 3<sup>rd</sup> and Sunday 4<sup>th</sup> September

Rural Life Living Museum, Reeds Road, Farnham, Surrey. GU10 2DL

The Rural Life Vintage Revival started as a small weekend gathering of stallholders, traders, musicians and entertainers celebrating the fashions, styles and music of the 1940 and 50s. Now in its fifth year, we will, once again, be celebrating the mid century era with music, entertainment and a vintage market. The event will be taking place over the weekend of 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> September with an evening dance on the night of Saturday 3<sup>rd</sup> September.

This year, there will also be a two-day VW Rally taking place alongside the Revival.

Each year we invite stallholders to showcase and sell their vintage and retro items from homewares to records, from handmade and retro clothes to upcycled furniture and lighting. **Please note that, for this event, we only require stalls that have vintage, retro or upcycled goods on offer. Please do not apply if your stock does not fall under these categories. We do, however, have space for a limited number of food stalls.**

The two-day event opens to the public at 10am on Saturday and closes at 5pm on Sunday with gates opening for stall set up at 8am on both days. Break down begins at 5pm on Sunday.

The Revival will close at 5pm on both days. On Saturday evening, there will be an evening dance with music from The Roosters from 8pm.

**Please note that this is not purely a vintage market. The weekend is full of entertainment and activities for visitors to enjoy and take part in should COVID-19 restrictions allow. Visitors to the Revival will be paying an entry fee.**

## Application Process

We also have a new price for stalls at the event. All pitches will be outside. We are no longer offering indoor pitches. We do, however, have a limited number of pitches under our marquees. These will be assigned on a first come, first served basis. All pitches are now priced at £45 each for the weekend. If you are assigned a marquee pitch, we will provide two approximately 3ft x 6ft tables. **We cannot guarantee an undercover pitch, but we will do our best to assign one when possible on a first come, first served basis.** If you choose a pitch, not undercover, you will need to bring a gazebo, chairs and tables with you. Basic camping is included in your stallholder fee with access to toilets and wash basins.

The application form can be found on our website. The closing date for applications is midnight on **Friday 19<sup>th</sup> August**. Payment for your pitch can be made through the Rural Life Vintage Revival web page on the museum's website.

Once you have submitted your form, full payment for your pitch must be made **by Friday 26<sup>th</sup> August**. If payment is not received by this date, it will be assumed that you will not be attending the event and unclaimed pitches will be opened to waiting list stallholders.

## Pitches

We have a new price for stalls for this event.

Each pitch costs £45 for the entire weekend. If you need more space for your stall you will need to purchase more pitches to accommodate it. All open pitches measure approx. 3m x 3m. **If you choose an uncovered pitch, you will need your own gazebo, chairs and tables. If you are assigned a pitch in one of our marquees, we will provide two 3ft x 6ft tables.**

**ALL stallholders MUST have public liability insurance to take part in this event. This is a necessary requirement and you will be asked for your public liability insurance details on the application form.**

**All electrical items brought onsite MUST have been PAT tested within the previous 12 months and be displaying a valid test sticker. Any items not meeting this requirement may not be used and can be confiscated until the end of the event. Items purchased in the last 12 months are exempt if a valid proof of purchase can be supplied on request.**

**If you are making a booking for a food stall, please send copies of paperwork for any LPG tanks you may be intending to use with your stall to [katie@rural-life.org.uk](mailto:katie@rural-life.org.uk) at the time of booking. On the day of the event, please ensure you display your food hygiene certificate.**

**If you are making a booking for a stall to sell alcoholic drinks, please send a copy of your Personal Licence to sell alcohol to [katie@rural-life.org.uk](mailto:katie@rural-life.org.uk) at the time of booking. If you do not have a Personal Licence, please contact us for the appropriate forms.**

If you would like to dress in era appropriate attire for the day, you are most welcome to do so and even encouraged but it is not essential.

- **Gates open to the main site at 8am.** You must not arrive before this time as you will not be able to access the site and you cannot park on the narrow country road running to the museum.
- A one-way system is in place at the museum. Stewards at the gate will guide you to your pitch site via the one-way system on arrival. Site layout map is attached below.
- **You must keep your speed below 5mph with hazard lights on as the site can get very busy with pedestrians during set up and break down.**
- Free car parking is provided at the front of the museum and all stallholders must remove their vehicles from inside the museum as soon as possible after unloading and no later than 9.45am and exit via the Forge Gate. No vehicles can remain onsite unless they form part of a display or rally.
- Vehicles and their contents are left in the museum car park at the owners own risk. The museum does not accept responsibility for any loss or damage to vehicles or their contents.
- The museum offers lockable storage areas to keep stock overnight.

- Stallholders are advised that the Rural Life Living Museum does not accept any liability for the safety of any stock, vehicles or personal affects brought onsite during the Rural Life Vintage Revival.
- Stallholders are required to exercise due care during set up and break down and comply with all relevant Health and Safety Legislation and abide by any restrictions that may remain in place during the COVID-19 pandemic. Should restrictions be reintroduced during this event, stallholders are advised to have a supply of hand sanitiser and wear face coverings when necessary.
- There will be designated First Aiders on site throughout the event. In case of an emergency please notify a steward or staff member.
- The event organisers will provide general waste bins and disposal facilities and request that all stallholders keep the site clear of any packaging or refuse associated with their stall.
- The use of naked flames is prohibited on the museum site.
- Smoking or the use of e-cigarettes is prohibited on the museum site. A smoking area is provided to the front of the museum opposite the café to the front of the wooden entry gate.
- The Trust reserves the right to cancel the event at any time without incurring costs from stallholders should government guidelines regarding coronavirus force them to do so. This includes circumstances where the Trust's ability to host or stage an event is, in the sole opinion of the Trust, severely compromised, even though there may be no general lockdown in place.
- In the event of cancellation, stallholders will be notified and refunds or transfers to alternative events will be offered.
- If stallholders do not attend the event having booked and paid for a pitch without prior notice, no refund will be given as the pitch will not be filled at such late notice.
- If you wish to cancel your pitch, please notify us before Friday 19<sup>th</sup> August and any monies will be returned to you minus a 20% non-refundable booking fee.
- Behaviour deemed as unacceptable by the events staff will result in termination of any future trading at the Rural Life Living Museum and may result in people being required to leave the site immediately.
- Our onsite café will be open from 8am for refreshments.

Please see site map below.

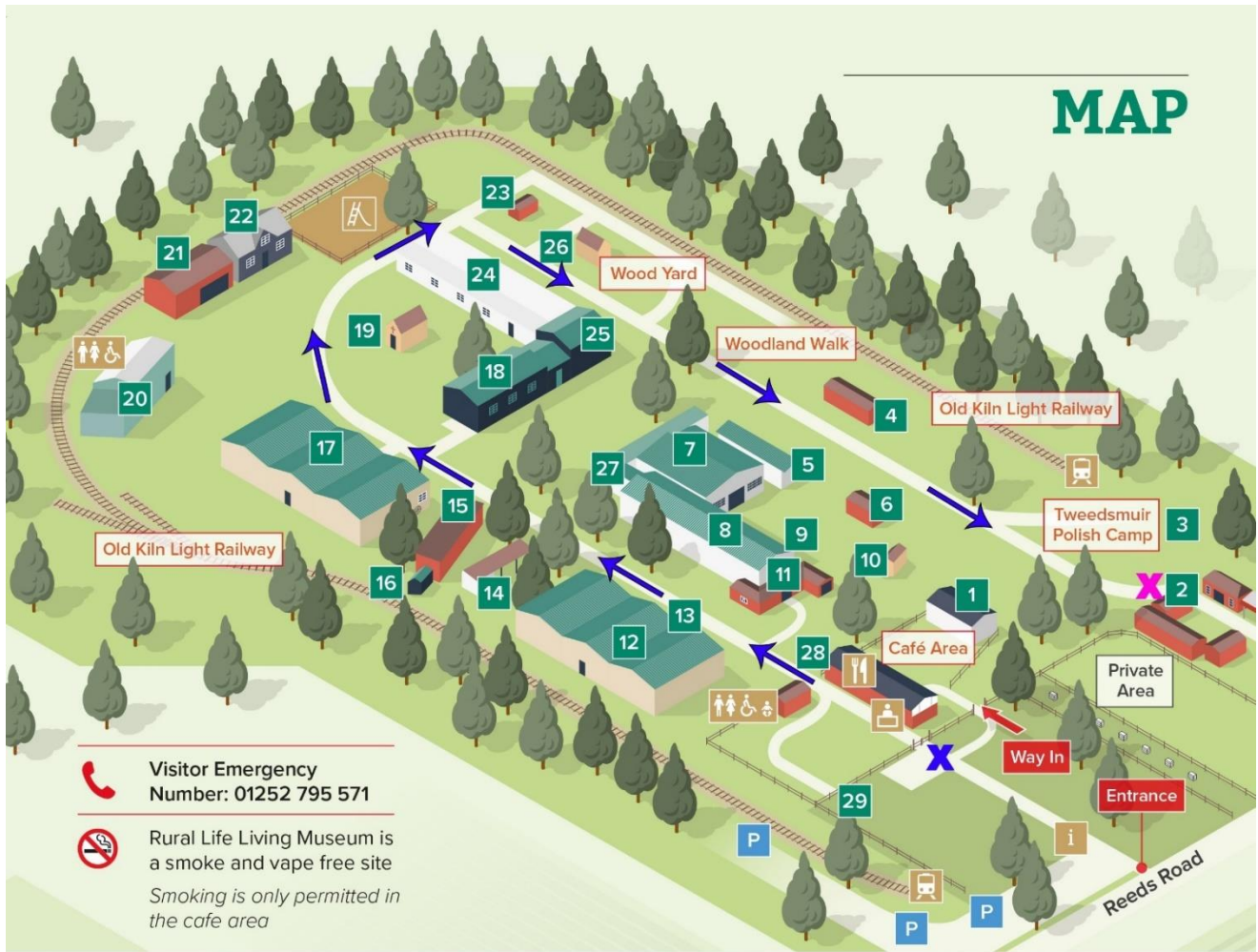
Stallholders will enter via the main gate from the Reeds Road and proceed down the main drive to the gate (blue X) where you will be met by a steward and directed to your pitch. When driving on the site, you must keep your speed below 5mph and proceed with hazard lights flashing.

In order to leave the site, stallholders must follow the course of the blue arrows to leave via the Forge Gate located between the buildings marked by a pink X.

Should any movement of vehicles be necessary when the site is open to the public, a steward will be required to walk out ahead of your vehicle to ensure the safety of any visitors that may be onsite.

Please note that there will be movement of a steam roller during this event, so for safety reasons you may only move a vehicle between the hours of 10am and 5pm on Saturday and 10am and 5pm on Sunday having first obtained permission from the event organiser and been allocated an escort steward.

**In the unlikely event of an emergency, access will be required via the Forge Gate. You must ensure that stalls or vehicles do not block this gate or the roadway leading to either gate.**
